Alexander Duboise Jr., loving father, brother, son and friend passed away on Tuesday May 26, 2020 at the age of 66 in his home that he resided for nearly 20 years. He was born on May 7, 1954 in Richmond, VA to Alexander Duboise Sr. and Juanita Spain-Duboise who preceded him in death.

Alexander, most commonly known as “Ricky” or “Rick” enjoyed being surrounded by family and friends. He prided himself on living peacefully and enjoying life to the fullest. Reciting quotes, giving words of encouragement and talking about his term in the marines were among his favorite things to do. He is especially known for his meticulousness, love of music, art and being a charismatic host in his home.

In 2016, Ricky retired from the federal government, where he proudly worked in security for over 20 years. He loved his career and prided himself on being a man in uniform. In 1973, he entered the military as a marines officer where he also received his high school diploma.
