Obituary

Elder Dr. Geraldine Ruffing also known as “Gerrie, Ma G, Doc, and Granny G” was born on August 3, 1945 in Fayetteville, NC to the late Jenny and Jack Jackson. Three months later she was adopted by the late J.W. and Lena Jones whom raised her with love. Gerrie attended schools in Arlington County, and was a graduate of Hoffman-Boston Junior/High School. After graduating high school Gerrie worked as a waitress, a short order cook and cashier. After being forced into unemployment she learned about the Opportunity Industrialization Center where she was able to take refresher courses in Business Administration. This led to the start in her career in government, as a clerk-stenographer at the Small Business Administration. She would later advance to the offices of DITD under the mentorship of Bruce Thompson, Counter Intelligence Office, and finally where she retired at DIA in May of 2014.

Gerrie began her Christian walk in February of 1958. Exactly a year later she was baptized and became a member of the Scripture Church of Christ. Throughout her years Gerrie served at several churches including, Montello Avenue Baptist, Way of the Cross under the leadership of Pastor Talbot, Rose of Sharon under the leadership of Elder Leemorse Bynum and finally Willing Heart Cathedral under the leadership of Reverend Thomas Pair and now Bishop Dr. JoAnn Spruell. Gerrie was ordained as a missionary in August of 1981, but also served throughout the years on the usher board, as a musician,

church clerk, choir member, Sunday school teacher/superintendent, prayer leader and minister. Gerrie attended the Wilber H. Water School of Religion and Theological Seminary where she obtained her Bachelors, Master, and Doctorate degrees. As God would have it, she graduated the same year as her children in 1997.

Gerrie moved to Washington DC in 1968. It was when she was doing one of the things she loved the most(bowling), that she met the love of her life Ellis Ruffing. After dating for several years, they were married on May 22, 1976. Of this union were born two children, Shawn Ruffing and Miesha Ruffing (Jones). Gerrie loved to bowl, volunteer, and make her famous sweet potato pies and monkey bread. She had recently begin learning how to make cakes from scratch. She loved to read and listen to music. She enjoyed shopping, going on cruises, playing cards and board games. She was a die-hard Redskins/Commanders fan and didn't mind going back and forth with anyone about her team, especially if you were a Cowboy fan. One of the highlights of her life was her grandson, and would share with anyone who would listen how proud she was of him and all of his accomplishments. She loved to preach and loved God above everything else.

She is preceded in death by her husband Ellis Ruffing and sister Debra Washington. She leaves to cherish her memories, her loving son Shawn Ruffing, her loving daughter Miesha Jones, her heart Joseph Jones Jr., her future son in law Thomas Bunch, her brother Jay Jones, her best friend Juanita McDonald, a host of nieces, nephews, relatives, friends, and her beloved church family at Willing Heart Cathedral
