Hubert Gilbert Winslow Hodge, affectionately known as Sydney, was born on August 24, 1937, in Betterverwaging, Guyana, to the late Louisa Bowen-Hodge and John Hodge.

He attended Mocha Methodist School and remained a faithful member of the Methodist Church

throughout his life, grounding himself in faith, humility, and service to others.

From a young age, Sydney demonstrated strength and responsibility helping care for his mother

and younger siblings the late Neville, Veronica “Eloise”, and Compton and developing the

resilience that defined his character.

He began his career at the Diamond Sugar Estate as an Industrial Machine Operator and later

worked at the Demerara Bauxite Company operating heavy machinery. He returned to the

Sydney migrated to the United States in 1985, where he met the love of his life, Linda. Their love blossomed into a lifelong partnership, and they were united in marriage on August 12, 1991. Their marriage was filled with deep affection—he lovingly called her “Momma,” and she called him “Papa.” Together, they shared a life centered on faith, family, dancing, laughter, and devotion. Sydney cherished Momma’s cooking, her giving heart, and her unwavering faith, and together they served the Lord faithfully while creating a home filled with love. Sydney’s working life reflected his perseverance and dedication.

Sydney continued his career with Southern Management Corporation, where he faithfully served for 21 years and earned recognition for his outstanding service before retiring in 2008.

Hubert Gilbert Winslow Hodge, affectionately known as Sydney, was born on August 24, 1937, to the

late Louisa Bowen and John Hodge in Beterverwagting (BV), Guyana. As a child, his family relocated to

Mocha Village, where he attended Mocha Methodist School and began laying the foundation for a life

defined by strength and determination.

Sydney was one of the finest sons of Mocha soil. He was a talented athlete and a skillful dancer who

loved music. He was also disciplined and confident from an early age. He took on significant

responsibilities at a young age becoming the provider for his mother and younger siblings, the late

Neville, Veronica “Eloise”, and Compton. These early sacrifices shaped his resilience and unwavering

work ethic.

He began his career at the Diamond Sugar Estate as an Industrial Machine Operator. Seeking greater
