James Randolph Dickens was born July 17, 1932, the eldest of eighteen children born to the late Samuel Dickens, Sr. and Eunice Johnson in Tarboro, North Carolina. He departed this life on Friday , February 19, 2016 at his home in Washington, DC surrounded by his loving family.

James received his primary and secondary education in the Public Schools System in Tarboro, North Carolina. He had an extensive work history as a stone mason.

James proudly served in the Korean War as a Combat Engineer in addition to being a Boxer in United State Special Service. While serving in Korea, James didn't forget about his brothers and sisters who worked as sharecroppers (along with his father) on the farms in Tarboro, North Carolina. He continued to send home money he earned as a Combat Engineer. These monies helped buy clothes, shoes, and food for our family during the 1950's (when trying to make a living on the farms was extremely difficult). More often than not, our father would be told by the overseer (after working all year) " you broke even again Mr. sam"!!!

Following his active duty service he devoted his life to family, and followed the teachings of Jesus Christ. James was a parishioner for many years at the Isle of Patmos Baptist Church in Washington, DC and more recently a member of Corinth Baptist Church.

James leaves to mourn his loving and devoted wife of 60 Years, Bessie Dickens of Washington, DC and his sons James Covington Dickens of Mount Rainier, MD, Billy Reginald Dickens (Jennie) of University Place, WA and George Wayne Dickens of Washington, DC.
