With her God given talents she would feed the neighborhood and beautify the ladies. Whether it was a line around the corner for one of Mrs. Lil gorgeous hairstyles, home cooked meals or a slice of her famous “Carrot Cake”, she did it to perfection! She had such good taste and was a woman of class and style from head to toe.

She was truly a special lady who didn't mind telling you just how she felt about anything! Often called “Feisty” Mrs. Lil was a Lively, Determined, Courageous Woman of God! Her zeal for life led her to relocate to Washington, D.C. where she worked as a Nurse at the Mt. Alto Hospital and later the Veterans Administration Hospital.

Accepting Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior early in life, she loved the Lord and often talked about his goodness, grace, and mercies. Serving as First
