After retirement, she continued to travel and visited Africa, Australia, New Zealand, Tahiti, Canada, Turkey and Singapore. She also enjoyed taking her grandchildren and later great grandchildren to the beach every summer.

She met her lifetime companion Ben Harrison in 1969. They were avid golfers and loved to bowl. She was active in two bowling leagues for many years. Her other 'love' was the casino. You might run into her at Live, MGM or even Atlantic City. She and her best friend Carrie Russell would travel to Atlantic City by bus at least once a year.

In the early 1990's she joined the Northeastern Presbyterian church. She attended church services until she was not able due to health reasons.
