As a victim advocate, she stood before judges to ensure that abused and battered women had their fair day in court. As a mom, she fought everything and everybody that dared to threaten the health or happiness of her children. On the Friday preceding her passing, she verbalized that she was done fighting and had “enough.” And so on Monday her fight was finished. Though we know we will see her again, she leaves behind many cherished memories of moments shared with those who absolutely adored her. Her grandchildren, Myesha L. Galvin, Tiana W. Buford, Tristin T. Galvin, Imani A. Buford, Shelby Buford III, and Kendall A. Buford; and, her children, Anthony (Crystal) Galvin, Chicago, IL and Yolonda (Shelby) Buford, Mitchellville, MD.
