Stephen Thomas Linden Baird was born to Thomas Victor Baird and Olga Lucille Baird on January 2, 1954 in Georgetown Guyana. He grew up with his siblings Kendrick Baird (deceased), Micheal Baird (deceased), Ann Baird, and Aubrey Baird. Stephen received his early education at St. Pius Roman Catholic School and later attended the Guyana Industrial Training Centre, where he studied Masonry. He took pride in learning a skilled trade and carried that work ethic with him throughout his life.

Over the years, Stephen worked for several notable organizations in Guyana, including Guyana Telecommunications Corporation, Guyana Pharmaceutical Corporation, and the Tobacco Factory. In 1991, he immigrated to the United States to join his parents along with his siblings, nephew and niece—a significant and courageous step that marked the beginning of a new chapter rooted in family, sacrifice, and determination. In his later years, his last known place of employment was with the Sumner Village Community Association, where he worked as a Maintenance Worker in the Facilities Department, quietly and faithfully contributing to the community around him. His strong work ethic supported his and his family's goal of achieving the American dream of homeownership.

Not only did Stephen work hard, he played hard too. Sports and games brought him joy and connection. He played soccer and dominoes at a competitive level and also took part in cricket and karate for a time. These interests were more than hobbies—they were spaces where he found camaraderie, challenge, and a sense of belonging.

He was known for his strong personality and love of attention, enjoying gambling, drinking, smoking, dancing and being surrounded by people. He had a way of expecting care and presence from others, and in return, he offered stories, laughter, and a presence that filled rooms.

Stephen leaves behind his sister and brother, Ann and Aubrey Baird, his son, Kevin, and daughter, Aleicia, and many nieces and nephews. While, he may no longer be physically present, his spirit lives on in shared memories, family stories, and the lessons learned simply by knowing him.
