



## Mr. Theodore Curtis Wilson

February 11, 1965 - August 19, 2022

On Friday, August 19, 2022 at 8:30 AM at the Washington Hospital Center, our Lord and Savior called Theodore Curtis Wilson home to eternal rest.

Theodore, known as “T-Bone and Bone Crusher” was born on February 11, 1965 at Columbia Hospital for Women in Washington, DC to Margo and Clinton “Teddy” Wilson. He was preceded in death by his father.

Tee was educated in the DC Public School system and the DC Catholic School system. His love for basketball dominated his early years. From the time he was three years old he loved all sports. Taking over the family TV to watch football, baseball, golf (smile), bowling, but his love for basketball outweighed them all. At five years old he was reading the sports section of the Washington Post. Asking his Grandmother for 15 cents, he would run down Corcoran Street to the corner store to get the newspaper. At Kingmans Boys and Girl Club he was outstanding on their basketball team. He attended Macklin Catholic High School and Coolidge High School, his position was point guard on the basketball teams (he wanted to control the ball and the team).

He first met Sylvania in the sixth grade at Garrison Elementary School and it was love-on forever. He doted on his daughters Tatiana and Tiara, determined that one of them was going to play basketball, and it was Tiara, who played on Wilson High School girl’s basketball team. When his grandchildren were born, he was the proudest grandfather. He never said no to babysitting or fixing them something to eat. Tee was always a protective,

loving and very respectful son, father, brother and uncle to his family. Willing to help anybody, his heart was full of love. He was always a happy person, especially around family.

He worked at the Community Academy Public Charter School for a few years then turned his attention to cooking (because he loved food). He worked at Wilson's Grill as a cook. He enjoyed cooking for his family especially his mother-in-law. Recently, he started his own catering service, T & S Seafood and Salads. He would prepare his special lobster rolls and seafood salad for the barbershops, salons, and Costco employees in the area for their lunch. He also was a Certified Personal Trainer.

On October 19, 1999, Tee turned his life over to God and was baptized by Reverend Eugene W. Burton at the Park Road Community Church in Washington, DC. At the time of his death Tee was attending the Seek and Save Deliverance Worship Center with his wife, sister-in-law and mother-in-law.

He leaves to cherish his memory, his best friend and loving wife Sylvania; two daughters, Tatiuna and Tiara; two grandchildren Antony and Amora; a devoted mother, Margo Payne; a cherished sister, Tisa Jackson; sisters: Cheryl, LaShonda, Debyn and Necole; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and other family members.
